Section 1 – VEGETABLES (Display on plates or paper plates)

| 1 | 3 Potatoes | Any variety, all the same, matching |
| 2 | 3 Carrots | Cut off the leaves |
| 3 | 3 Beetroots | Cut off the leaves |
| 4 | 4 Shallots | Remove the roots, matching |
| 5 | 3 Onions | Remove the roots, matching |
| 6 | 2 Cabbages | Cut the stalk |
| 7 | 2 Cucumbers | Well matched |
| 8a | 5 Runner Beans | Pick carefully to leave some stalk attached, matching |
| 8b | 5 Broad Beans | Pick carefully to leave some stalk attached, matching |
| 8c | 5 French Beans | Pick carefully to leave some stalk attached, matching |
| 9a | 5 Round Tomatoes | Leave the calyx attached |
| 9b | 5 Cherry Tomatoes | Leave the calyx attached |
| 10 | 2 Marrow/Squash | Leave some stalk attached, matching |
| 11 | 3 Courgettes | Young, tender and shapely, matching |

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| 12 | 2 Lettuces | Remove the roots, may remove outer leaves |
| 13 | 1 bunch of 6 Radishes | Leaves still attached |
| 14 | 3 Turnips | Cut leaves |
| 15 | 5 Brussel Sprouts | Cut from main stem, matching |
| 16 | 2 Cauliflower/Broccoli | Clean, matching |
| 17 | 3 Parsnips | Equal size roots |
| 18a | 6 Pods of Peas | Pick carefully to leave some stalk attached |
| 18b | 6 Pods of Mangetout | Pick carefully to leave some stalk attached |
| 19a | 9 Chilli Peppers | Fruits of matched shape, size and colour |
| 19b | 3 Sweet Peppers | Any type. Fruits of matched shape, size and colour |
| 20 | 1 Pumpkin | Well Formed, mature and of good colour |
| 21 | 3 Leeks | Matched |
| 22 | 2 Sweetcorn | Matched |
| 23 | 1 Bunch of 6 Spring Onions | Matched |
| 24 | 2 of any other vegetable | Not separately classed above |
| 25 | Collection of 5 Herbs | In a jar of water |
| 26 | 3 Stems of Rhubarb | Part of the leaf still attached. |
| T1 | Tray of Vegetables | A tray with a display of 5 vegetables from the list above, the same number of each as seen above |
| T2 | Novice's Tray | A tray displaying any 3 from the list above. For allotment holders who have never entered a produce show before |
| T3 | Children's Tray for Under 12s | A tray with any 3 from the list above |

Section 2 – FRUIT (Please display on plates or paper plates)

|----|--------------------------|---|
| 27 | Plate of 6 Strawberries | Leave the green part attached |
| 28 | Plate of 6 Gooseberries | Leave as much stem on as you can |
| 29 | 3 Strigs of Currants | Must still be attached to the bunch or 'strig', not separate fruits |
| 30 | 6 Cane Fruit | (e.g. Raspberries, Loganberries). Must have stalks attached |
| 31 | Plate of any other fruit | 6 specimens of any variety |

Section 3 – FLOWERS (Please bring your own vase or jam jar)

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| 32 | One Perfect Rose | May be any variety |
| 33 | 3 Pinks or Carnations | |
| 34 | One Vase of 5 Mixed Annuals/5 Perennials | |
| 35 | 6 Sweet Peas | Any well matched flowers/any colours |
| 36 | Arrangement of any Edible Flowers | Flower arrangement of any style, using your own flowers, in your choice of vase |

Section 4 – COOKERY AND PRESERVES (For preserves, please indicate the date made)

|----|------------------------------|---|
| 37 | A Glass Jar of Jam or Jelly | Any variety. Up to 12oz – 1lb: 300-500g |
| 38 | A Glass Jar of any Marmalade | Up to 12oz – 1lb: 300-500g |
| 39 | A Homemade Loaf of Bread | Any Recipe, but NOT from a bread maker |
| 40 | Jar of Chutney | Any variety. Up to 12oz – 1lb: 300-500g |
| 41 | Jar of Pickled Onions | Up to 12oz – 1lb: 300-500g |
| 42 | Jar of Pickled Beetroot | (Whole/Sliced) Up to 12oz – 1lb: 300-500g |
| 43 | A Decorated Cake | Judged for decoration, not the cake underneath |
| 44 | A Fruit Cake | Baked to your own favourite recipe. Should not be iced |
| 45 | A Victoria Sponge | Traditional Victoria Sponge with jam and butter cream |
| 46 | A Cake using a Vegetable | (e.g. Carrot Cake, Courgette Cake). Be adventurous! |
